(*1)BME is a campaign jointly run by Marriage For All Japan (MFAJ), a non-profit organization, Lawyers for LGBT & Allies Network (LLAN), and Nijiiro Diversity, an accredited non-profit organization, with the aim of visualizing companies that support equality in marriage (legislation of same-sex marriage) in Japan.

(*2) The "Business Support for LGBT Equality in Japan" is a campaign in which four organizations (Japan Alliance for Legislation to Remove Social Barriers based on Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity(Japan Alliance for LGBT Legislation, J-ALL), Human Rights Watch, Athlete Ally, and All Out) work together to urge companies and organizations to support the establishment of the "LGBT Equality Law" with the aim of creating workplaces and societies in Japan where discrimination based on gender orientation and gender identity is prohibited and everyone is treated equally.
